## Registration Information

Per the sample schedule on the following page, The Texas Vaulting Expo event will have 2 educational tracks (1 for coaches/lungers/vaulters to move through as pods, and 1 for volunteers) and an unrecognized Vault N Texas Funfest component with barrel freestyle classes ONLY. As the vaulting community has grown quite fast over the last few years, we see a need to provide education from every angle to increase our club's overall horsemanship and rulebook knowledge as it pertains to vaulting, school our horses in new facilities, and train our volunteers (who without these events would not be possible). This event is sponsored by Region 4 and is purely educational, and the Vault N Texas Funfest holds no recognition. The goal of this event is to lay the foundation for execution of a successful recognized competition in the fall of 2023, similar to that in the fall of 2022 and at the same location, but for 2 days on November 11-12. We need the support of all members of the vaulting community to grow our sport and provide a safe and successful environment for our athletes to learn and compete. Friday will include a split session with two judges for coaches/lungers with horses ONLY. **NO VAULTERS IN ATTENDANCE ON FRIDAY SESSIONS. BRING ALL THE HORSES FOR THE WEEKEND FOR TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES!**

All coaches/lungers/vaulters and also volunteers will take part in both the clinic and funfest and must register in Compweb (BUT ONLY PAY FEES FOR VAULTERS) for this event to be sure the correct number of entrants is captured. Membership with the Equestrian Vaulting USA is not required for this event but is encouraged so vaulters may take advantage of the many benefits EVUSA provides. Volunteer jobs will be chosen by clubs prior to the event, and on the job training will be provided starting Saturday morning. Each vaulter must have at least one volunteer representative (that is NOT a coach/lunger) in attendance all day Saturday to fill the required volunteer job for the Funfest. In Compweb, please add your volunteers as participants, but not as a vaulter (as there is no fee for the volunteer registration). In the EVUSA number column add VOL and a number to indicate they are a volunteer. (This is so we may track the total number of attendees) Additionally, please do invite your friends and family to come watch the Vault N Texas Fun Fest event in the afternoon at 3pm. ## **Bios**

**Crystal Pakizer** was introduced to vaulting at the age of 4. Just after her 5th birthday, she joined the AVA and Region 1's Valley View Vaulters in Southern California. In her first year, she was a member of VVV's National Championship winning 2-Phase Team. In 1991, Crystal helped form Mountain Springs Vaulters where, in rapid succession, she rose through the ranks of the sport from Trot through Gold, winning dozens of Regional titles and National Championships. During her competitive career, she was invited by numerous clubs to join Composite teams and was proud to be chosen to represent the United States as a member of the Friendship Team that performed demonstrations at the Atlanta, GA 1996 Olympics. Crystal was also an ambassador to the sport of vaulting by giving clinics to other equestrian centered activities such as Trick Riding and Rodeo organizations. In 2004, Crystal enlisted in the US Army for four years where she served as a Veterinary Technician working such details as the Military Color Guard and the Secret Service. After taking a brief hiatus, Crystal returned to her passion of vaulting by organizing and coaching the Rogue River Vaulters in Southern Oregon's beautiful Rogue Valley. After spending 32 years associated with the sport of vaulting, Crystal feels that as a judge, she is determined to pass along the ideals of self-confidence, good health, fitness, a strong work ethic, commitment, establishing life-long friendships, mentorship, and equestrian education and appreciation.

**Rosie Brown** first joined the EVUSA in February 1988, and through this sport found her true passion and calling in life. The life lessons learned through hard work, teamwork, dedication, determination, responsibility, accountability, commitment, communication, structure, stability, organization, and more will forever impact her ability to succeed and also lead others to success. In the last 30 years, she has started (or re-started) 4 clubs from California to Texas, coached vaulters to local, regional, national, and international championship titles, taught summer camps, organized international vaulting trips, coordinated local, regional, and national competitive and educational events, clerked, input scores, and volunteered at WEG 2010 in Lexington and again as judges staff at WEG 2018 in Tryon. After retiring as a vaulter in 1992, she held club-related positions such as club manager, program manager, coach, lunger, trainer, clinician, president, treasurer, secretary, and EVUSA-related positions such as Regional Supervisor for Region's II and IV, Region IV President, and Vice-President, EVUSA Social Media Committee Chairman, and joined various other committees in the last 20 years, including the USEF Vaulting Sport Committee as from January 2019 to 2023. After retiring as a coach in 2019, she joined the EVUSA Judge's Program to continue learning about this sport from the other side of the lens and continue to make an impact on the development of equestrian vaulting and received her EVUSA "r" status in December 2021 and her USEF "R" designation in April 2023.

**Samantha Kacir** Sam has been riding and working with horses since 1996. She has a wide variety of experience in different horse related sports. She started in the eventing discipline and was heavily involved in Pony Club growing up. In college she worked as a Polo Groom and exercise rider. Fast forward to today through her twin daughters love of vaulting Sam has jumped head first into learning this sport to support its growth in the Central Texas Area. In 2022, Sam received her CHA Certification as a Vaulting Instructor.

**Alex Schaubhut** is a member of the Lone Star Vaulters and has been involved with vaulting since 2006 as a competitor, coach, and clinician. Prior to finding vaulting she was an elite level gymnast who grew up with horses, so it was only natural to combine the two sports. As a vaulter, she has been competing at the international 3\*Senior level for the past 10 years, and also in the Pas de Deux and team divisions. In 2010 she was a member of the National Champion C-Team and performed for thousands as a part of the Friendship Team exhibition at the World Equestrian Games in Kentucky. In 2014 she and her Pas de Deux partner traveled to the West Coast and Canada to try out for the World Equestrian Games in Normandy, France, and won the 2\* division at the Pacific Coast CVI and qualified as alternates to represent the US on the world stage. She has been to Europe to train and compete in CVI's and in 2017 won the 3\* division at the Rocky Mountain Cup CVI in Loveland, CO. She has coached tiny tots and gold vaulters, and everything in between.

**Caroline Schubert** started vaulting in 2003 when she was just 6 years old, competed for 15 years up to the Gold level individually as well as at Open Pas de Deux, Open 2-Phase team, and B-Team levels. She has won National titles in both Prelim Pas de Deux as well as Open 2-Phase team, and has also participated in a number of friendship demonstrations around the country. With that said, team and partner work are some of her strengths and enjoys building freestyles and working with music and artistry with the help of her dance background. Outside of vaulting she enjoys running, latin dancing, and riding for fun. She spent the last three years in a location without any vaulting and is excited to be in San Antonio near so much vaulting activity and looks forward to working with all the eager talent.

## **Region 4 Horsemanship Award**

The Texas Vaulting Expo is one of many educational events throughout the region with a focus on horsemanship in an effort to elevate the expectations of this horse-first sport. Vaulters, coaches, lungers, and owners must all put the welfare of our equine partners first. Much like the sportsmanship award, we would like to recognize the clubs whose horses and lungers who are turned out at the highest level in terms of soundness, grooming, overall body condition and cleanliness, along with proper fit, and use of equipment at competitions offering classes on the horse. This award will be determined by the event officials and presented at the close of the competition. Throughout 2023 we will be developing an All-around Vaulter Award program to rollout to the region in 2024. More to come on this topic in time. THIS AWARD WILL NOT BE GIVEN AT THE TEXAS VAULTING EXPO.

## General Information

**ARENAS:** The competition arena is fully enclosed and measures 245'x145'. The arena is lit, wired for sound, and has sand based footing in the vaulting rings. The ceiling height is a minimum of 14 ft.

**ARRIVAL:** Horses may arrive on Friday after 3pm. Sessions will begin on Saturday at 8am. It is encouraged that you arrive no later than 7am to feed and groom your horses.

**AWARDS:** Placings will be given through 5<sup>th</sup>.

**BARRELS:** Square handled barrels will be provided.

**HOTEL:** The following hotels will honor a \$25/night discount when mentioning the Heritage Country Church. Holiday Inn Express, 1991 N Stagecoach Rd, Salado and Days Inn 10825 S IH 35, Salado.

**RV PARKING:** RV parking onsite is limited ONLY to RVs that do not require hookups for power or water and have their own restrooms and running water. If you plan to park at the facility you must park behind the stabling area.

**DIRECTIONS:** Upon entering the gate to the property, make an immediate right along the fence line to the back of the property (look for the huge cross). This will take you to the arena parking closest to the stalls and the arena. Spectators are welcome to park in the paved parking lot on the front side of the property.

**FACILITIES:** There is a separate climate-controlled event room with adequate space for scorers and classroom style learning. There are restrooms available on site. There are animal wash areas available.

**FOOD:** The onsite kitchen will be serving breakfast tacos and coffee for breakfast, and have lunch options such as brisket sandwich, hamburgers, nuggets, corn dogs, and hotdogs, cheese curds, fried pickles, french fries, and onion rings. A veggie burger option will be provided. No dairy free/gluten free options. Their food is 5 star!

**PARKING:** There is adequate free vehicle parking.

**PETS:** No dogs or other pets allowed in the arena, except service animals. Dogs on leash only allowed on the Fairgrounds.

**RIDING:** The arena is available for riding prior to 8am on Saturday. Appropriate footwear and an approved helmet are required at all times when riding.

**STALLING/BEDDING:** HCC will provide the option to purchase either single 12'x12' stalls or double 12'x24' stalls. 2 bags will be included per single stall and 4 bags will be included per double stall. Additional shavings must be purchased from HCC @ \$9/bag. Tack stalls do not include shavings. Stalls do not need to be stripped.

**VOLUNTEER JOBS:** Volunteer jobs will be chosen ahead of time and trained Saturday morning and on the spot during the day. Each vaulter must have at least one volunteer representative (other than a coach/lunger) in attendance the entire weekend to fill the required volunteer job. In Compweb, please add your volunteers as participants, but not as a vaulter as there is no fee for this type of registration. In the EVUSA number column add VOL and a number to indicate they are a volunteer. We just need to know who will be attending.

This recipient may be a vaulter, volunteer, coach, lunger, or trainer. Additionally, the recipient must:

- abide by the EVUSA Region 4 Sportsman Pledge
- demonstrate an ongoing commitment and dedication to the promotion of equestrian sport
- serve as a positive role model for peers
- exhibit characteristics that exemplify positive sportsmanship principles

## Rules and Regulations

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT EVUSA RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE EVUSA RULES UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED.

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees, including in regards to COVID-19 specific rules and guidelines.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation

No person will be allowed in the competition circle during the time of judging except the vaulter and lunger and those having official or requested duties to perform, such as boosters in classes where boosting is permitted.

It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

### **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:**

Negative Coggins is required, and a current (within 30 days) health certificate is required for horses traveling from out of state. Please have a hard copy of these documents upon arrival.

### **COVID-19 SPECIAL RULES/NOTICES**

The competition will follow current local and state guidelines regarding masks and COVID-19 requirements. At the current time, non-vaccinated individuals are encouraged to wear masks when indoors. If this changes prior to the competition, all entered vaulters will be notified. Individuals may choose to wear a face covering/mask even when not required. Anyone choosing to do so, will not be penalized.

In the stabling area/barns, ONLY competitors, coaches and grooms are allowed.

Individuals who demonstrate non-compliance with local, state or Federal rules regarding mask/face covering requirements or social distancing will be promptly removed from the competition grounds.



## **Entries, Payments, Refunds and Late Fees - Read this Carefully:**

**All Entries** MUST be made through CompWeb:

Payments must be mailed or electronically submitted by March 1, 2023. If you wish to pay by electronic means you may pay through PayPal at: [paypal.me/avaregioniv](https://paypal.me/avaregioniv).

**Refunds:** In the case of injury to a participant or a horse before the start of the event, refunds will be provided minus a \$5 processing fee, only if event management is notified of the scratch in writing before the event starts, and appropriate medical documentation is provided. If a vaulter cannot compete due to COVID-19 restrictions, refunds will be issued less the \$5 processing. No refunds will be provided for injuries sustained at the event. Event management reserves the right to decide all issues related to potential refunds whether due to documented changes in entries or incorrect assessment of fees. Refunds are processed after the close of the competition and provided to the club.

**Late fees:** A late fee of \$50 will be assessed for late payment postmarked/late payments. Late fees of \$5 per form or \$50 per club will be assessed for late and incorrect paperwork. Late fees of \$5 per track, or \$50 per club will be assessed for late, missing or incorrectly labeled music.

**Returned Checks:** There will be a \$25 processing fee for returned checks, and scores for those entries will be voided until payment is received.

**Draw:** Draw will be done by computer by March 2, 2023, by Event Management.

**Coaches Check-In:** Coaches check-in will take place Saturday morning as the first instructional item on the volunteer training schedule at 8am. Each club must provide a blank check upon check-in to cover any missing forms, late registrations, shavings not purchased through the facility, or any other items at the sole responsibility of the club.

## **Class Rules**

Vaulters may **ONLY** enter into **ONE** individual barrel freestyle, and **ONE** pairs, and **ONE** team freestyle class to ensure our event takes place in the time allotted. **Vaulter DOB MUST be entered into compweb so we are able to breakdown divisions by age where necessary.** Incomplete entries will result in a \$5 charge to chase down.

## Barrel Classes

**66a. Tiny Tot Barrel FS** – To be performed as Advanced Novice Walk but on the barrel for ages 7 and under. Boost **required** with no penalty, and assistance throughout the performance will not result in any penalties. ONLY E and M DOD allowed. No trampolines.

**67a. Beginning Barrel FS** – To be performed as Advanced Novice Walk but on the barrel. Boost **required** with no penalty, and assistance throughout the performance will not result in any penalties. ONLY E and M DOD allowed. No trampolines.

**68a. Intermediate Barrel FS** – To be performed as Trot or Copper but on the barrel. Boost allowed. Any level of DOD allowed. No trampolines.

**69a. Advanced Barrel FS** – To be performed as Bronze but on the barrel. **NO** Boost allowed. Any level of DOD allowed. No trampolines.

**70a. Beginning Barrel Pas de Deux** – Any 2 vaulters the walk level. 90 seconds. Boost **required** with no penalty, and assistance throughout the performance will not result in any penalties. ONLY E and M DOD allowed. No trampolines..

**72a. Intermediate Barrel Pas de Deux** – Any 2 vaulters from any levels. 90 seconds. Boost allowed. Any DOD is allowed. No trampolines.

**74a. Barrel Team FS** – Up to 8 vaulters from any levels. 3-4 minutes. Any DOD is allowed. No trampolines.
